
#### NATIONAL RICE DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY (GHANA)



## BACKGROUND

- Ghana 30% self-sufficient in rice
   production
- Total rice demand (tons) : 600,000mt
- Range of Domestic production (tons) : 200,000-300,000 tons (130,000-200,000 tons milled)
- Agro-ecological Zones and Production
  - Irrigated : 8%
  - Lowland/Inland Valleys: 77%
  - Upland : 15%
  - Per Capita Production of rice : 20kg paddy/ 13kg milled
- The per capita rice consumption (PCC):38kg/person/year
- Based on population and demand growth rates – (PCC) 41.1kg by 2010 and 63.0kg by 2015 giving an aggregate demand of 1,680,000t/year


#### **List of On-Going/ Closed Interventions**

Comments On-Going/ Closed Interventions :

- Irrigation projects have undertaken rehabilitation and improvement of existing structures; no new infrastructure constructed
- Duration and coverage of project interventions for national impact and sustainability need to be considered
- Baseline studies under the NRDS should consider impact assessment of past projects over the last 5 -10 year, using desktop methodology and on short term basis

"Unclassified": When the intent or nature of the interventions are unclear "Out": Project Coordination/M & E components of projects

- aGh-13 provided support for seed as part of agricultural support
- *bGH13-2-1* provided support for fertilizer
- *cGH3-1,2* addressed infrastructural development
- *dGH13-3* addressed information/knowledge
- *e GH-5-1-* addressed information/knowledge

- Ghana, among 12 Sub-Saharan CARD Priority Countries, expects to benefit from IFAD Small Grant Project which seeks to Link Rice Value Chains Development with the Growth and Poverty Reduction Processes in Africa.
