## General comments

Category	Comments
1.Title	-Does not reflect the contents -Choice of a more attractive title
2. Justification	- Coherent explanation of the current problem -How the project will solve the problem
3.CNs' linkages	-Description of the linkages with the relevant documents such as sector policy/strategy & CAADP -Clear description of linkages between NRDS & SIEM resources - Inter-linkages of CNs & how they-re-enforce each other
<b>4.Location &amp; target groups</b>	-Further elaboration for the <u>coverage area</u> : Where (location) -Clear indication of the <u>target groups (Nature)</u> -How the project will lead to the improvement of target groups
<b>5.Objectives/outputs</b>	-Implementation strategies: <u>modalities on how to involve the</u> <u>beneficiaries, take stock of past achievements and the partnership to</u> <u>be developed (Synergy) with other stakeholders</u>
6.Enabling environment	Focus on interventions which should allow the creation of a suitable environment, particularly if private sector is concerned in terms of investment (mechanization, infrastructureetc.)
7.Other comments	Lack of costing, very high costing, lack of information on projects duration / sources of funding, no need of extra information that are not relevant & no inclusion of many components in one concept note.

- Concept notes should be considered as a path towards the funding of the countries priorities. In this regard, improvement has to be done by incorporating key advice given.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

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- For NRDS implementation, the champions being already identified in each country, diversify the participation to the process of NRDS implementation, particularly with other key line ministries and private sector who needs a suitable environment in terms of policies & appropriate policy tools..
