Background

Introducing Indonesia is beginning with as a part of South East Asia countries. Indonesia has more than 17,000 island, stretching for more than 5,000 km across the equator. Lies between the Australian and Asian Continental and dividing the Pacific and Indian ocean, Consists of five (5) main island (SUMATERA, KALIMANTAN, SILAWESI, PAPUA AND JAVA), And 30 smaller archipelagoes.

Indonesia is one of the countries that joined in the New Asia Africa Strategic Partnership (NAASP) which have a high awareness of the problems that occur in other parts of the world, especially countries in Asia, Pacific, and Africa. One form of concern for Indonesia is to provide technical assistance to developing countries in the Asia, Pacific, and Africa.

Cooperation within the framework of the Non-Aligned Countries / South-South Cooperation has been realized by the Government of Indonesia since the 1980s until today and already covers about 50 countries including Africa (15 countries), Asia (20 countries), America (3 countries), Middle East (4 countries) and the Pacific (8 countries)

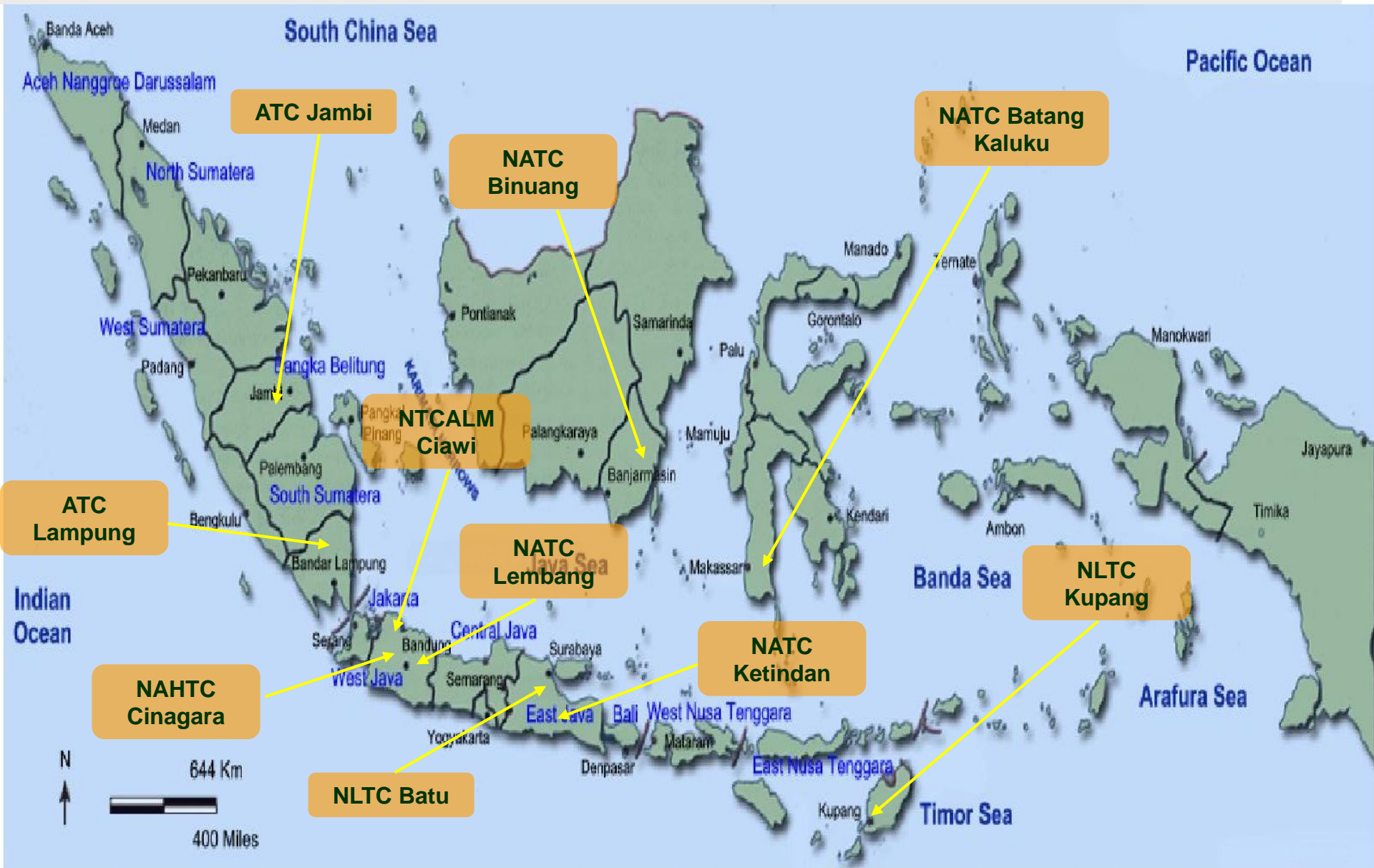
In order to accelerate agricultural development in African countries, in 1996 the Indonesian government has built two Agricultural Training Center :

1. In Jenoi, Gambia, which is intended for farmers in West Africa,
2. In Mkodo Morogoro, Tanzania, for East Africa farmers

Agriculture Rural Farmer Training Center Jenoi, Gambia, operated since 1998 has trained more than 1500 farmers of the Gambia and 60 farmers from six West African countries (Senegal, Mali, Niger, Sierra Leone, Guinea Bissau, Guinea Conakry)

Other activities in order to support agricultural development in Africa is, the Indonesian government sent experts and skilled farmers to African countries and also apprenticeship African farmers in Indonesia, as well as the providing agricultural equipment and machinery
