Issues

- Regarding implementation of the Working Weeks

Some of the propriety interventions earmarked has challenge in implementing them because of limited funds fro government and other development partners.

- Regarding negotiating the champions

The champions are pushing forward rice related interventions. President, Prime Minister and ASLM Ministers and technical champions are working hard to Ensure cereal crop production for food security and income to farmers (towards Commercial agriculture). Agriculture First (Kilimo Kwanza) is a top agenda in the country and has motivated private sector to invest on almost all tradable interventions on rice.

- Regarding securing the funds on rice-related interventions

- (i) **For interventions that profitable have been attracted private sector to invest on them. Example private sector has increasingly investing on quality improvement on rice because there is a profit.**
- (ii) **Government (including President) has instructed potential areas for rice production. Example is in Rufiji Valley (Kilombero, Rufiji and Kilosa districts) where companies like Kilombero Plantations Ltd has invested on rice production**
- (iii) **The current and planned major investments in the agricultural sector focus mainly in food (cereal) crop production including rice there fore initiatives like SAGCOT are being encouraged.**
