CARD(Coalition for African Rice Development);

- was established in 2008 at TICAD IV by AGRA, NEPAD, and JICA
- aims at <u>doubling rice production</u> in Sub-Sahara Africa by 2018
 Overall Goal
- is a consultative group of bilateral and multilateral donors and African and international organizations/institutions
 - Steering Committee members; AfDB, Africa Rice Center, AGRA, FAO, FARA, IFAD, IRRI, JICA, JIRCAS, NEPAD, WB
- fully respects <u>African ownership and leadership</u>
 - Participation of African Institutions, AfricaRice, AfDB, FARA, NEPAD
 - Alignment to CAADP
- provides various types of support, but not financial one
- works in 23 CARD member countries







Identify specifications of required machineries for different *ecosystems* of rice production








Rice Production in Sub-Saharan Africa (1,000MT)




