



# **Identified priority areas and Concept Notes**

### A) Priority areas: 4 in total

- 1) Maintenance, rehabilitation and integrated development of potential rice fields;
- 2) Promotion of modern rice farming technologies through an approach involving rice extension centres in marshland, irrigated areas and on hillsides;

#### Who there are

- 1) This is a seed cooperative, specialising in the production and marketing of seeds for food crops, including rice.
- 2) Farmers are grouped into cooperatives and/or associations dedicated to the production of seeds for different crops on the hills and especially in the marshlands for rice seed production.

#### What they do

1) Supply improved seeds.

#### <u>Impacts</u>

- 1) Improved living standards.
- 2) Rice farmers' average income improved.

- 1) Availability of pre-basic seeds by ISABU;
- 2) Technical support from MINEAGRIE (DPFAPFNL, ONCCS and SRDI),
