

Paddy production and area harvested





- 1) Availability of quality seeds and other rice-specific inputs
- 2) Water management for rice production
- 3) Access to modern agricultural equipment
- 4) Paddy processing (50% of production processed locally)
- 5) Marketing and promotion of the Beninese label
- 6) Farm advisory services and governance of the sector
- 7) Access to suitable rice-growing funding and promoting employment of youth and women

Orientation/ Specificities	 The project aims to develop 100 ha of lowlands through hydro agricuture, with partial water control for rice and maize production. The project is spearheading the installation of five solar-powered mini-stations to pump water to five rice-growing areas (SOTA) measuring 50 hectares each in the Malanville commune. 	Development of entrepreneurial initiatives for 1,100 young people in the three target sectors, including rice

New projects launched after the start of CARD phase 2

Negotiations for other projects are at an advanced stage:

- Project to develop 2,155 ha in the Ouémé valley, co-funded by IBD-BOAD, CFAF 91.3 billion;
- Project to develop 1500ha in the Mono valley with BADEA: 50 million Units of Account
- ➤ Additional financing from the World Bank for the Project to Support the Competitiveness of Sectors and the Development of Exports (PACOFIDE): **USD 50 million**

Value chain development through private sector participation

PREMIUM RICE MILL BENIN.

Who are they?

- 1) Company specialising in rice processing
- 2) Set up in Benin in 2020 in Malanville and Glazoué

What do they do?

- 1) Buy paddy from farmers under contract at a predetermined price and process it in their own processing units (2 units x 35t/hour)
- 2) Market white rice in local supermarkets under their own brand name and in 5 kg, 10 kg, 25 kg and 50 kg packs

Public sector support

- 1) Ease of installation and tax breaks
- 2) Facilitating access to credit via the FNDA [National Fund for Agricultural Development] (guarantee and interest-rate subsidy)
