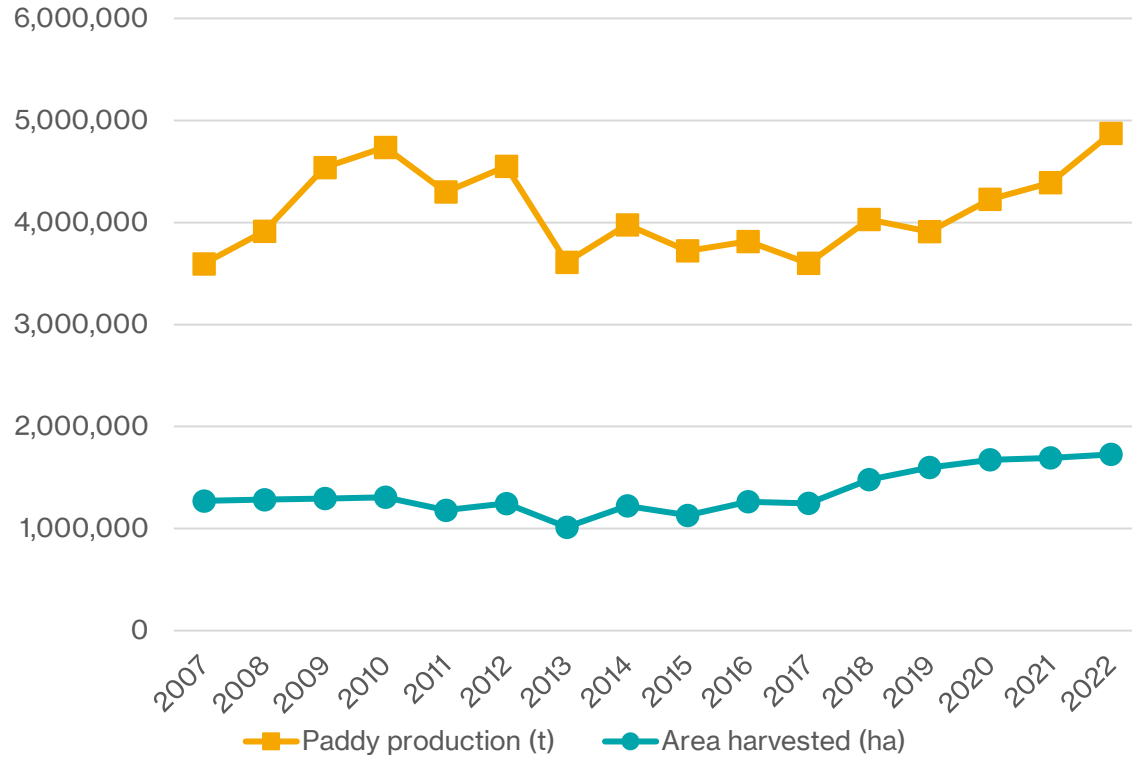

Paddy production and Area harvested

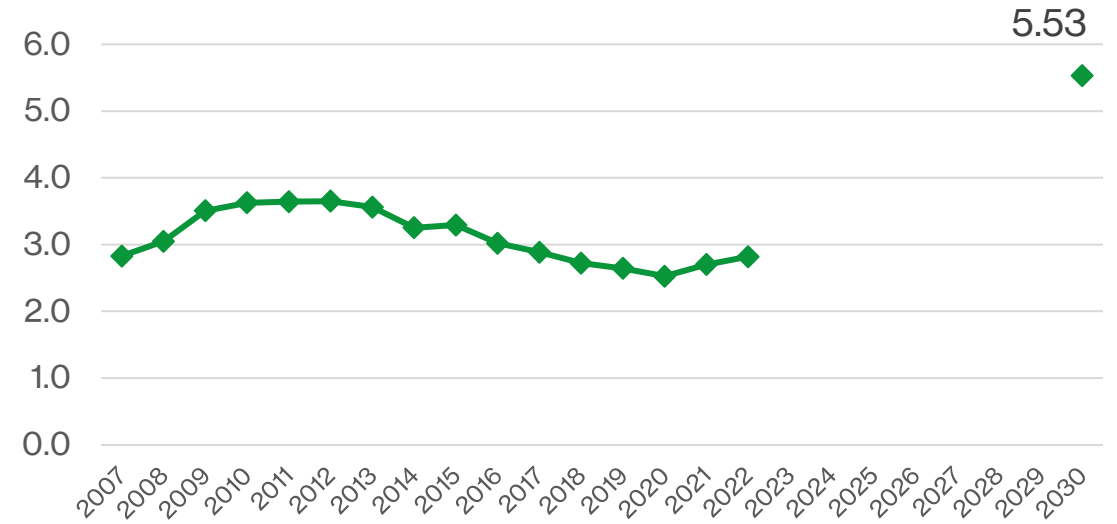

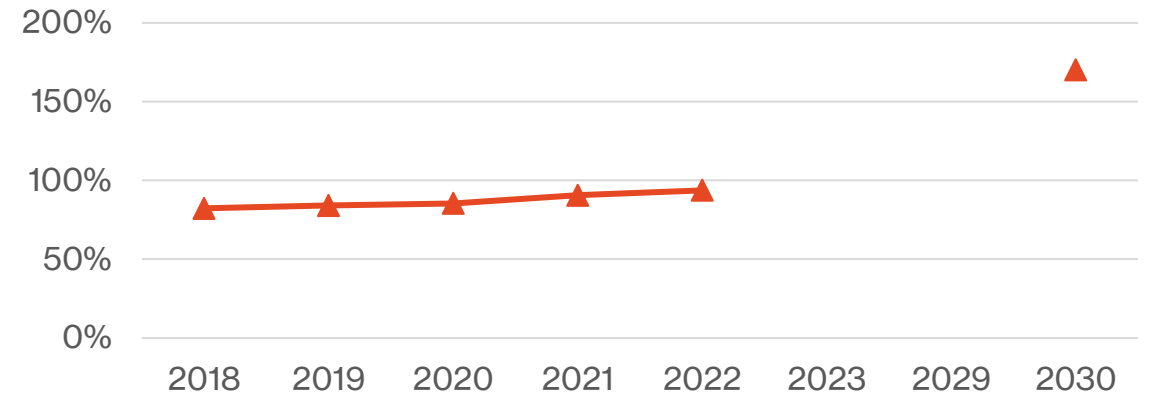

Identified priority areas and concept notes

I. PRIORITY AREAS

- 1) To sustainably increase rice productivity and production in order to meet local demand and generate a surplus for export;
- 2) To strengthen action-research and capacities of stakeholders;;
- 3) To promote industrialisation, processing, marketing and competitiveness.

II. CONCEPT NOTES OR PROJECT IDEAS

- 1) Development of the rice seed industry;
- 2) Development and rehabilitation of irrigated areas;
- 3) Development of rainfed rice cultivation;
- 4) Establishment of regional rice offices;
- 5) Establishment and replenishment of 23 Regional Funds for the Maintenance of Hydroagricultural Networks (FRERHA);
- 6) Support to intensification of rice related activities;
- 7) Improvement of post-harvest rice management.

Value chain development through private sector participation

1. LE RELAIS DE MADAGASCAR

Who are they?

- 1) Social enterprise created in 2008 and operating in the Haute Matsiatra region
- 2) Specialised in agricultural and rice production, production of organic fertilisers, textiles, car manufacturing, sorting of second-hand clothes and hospitality business.

What do they do (in the rice sector)? : activity launched in 2013

- 1) Contract with rice farmers' producer organisations (POs) (over 150 in 2022) with predetermined prices that are revised each year (upwards, never downwards) in meetings jointly held with the POs to determine the share to be apportioned to a solidarity fund,
- 2) Establishment of a seed system with POs, training and supply of organic fertiliser to producers,
- 3) Purchase of paddies from producers and milling in its own rice mill (the only one in the region)
- 4) Sale to local players (NGOs, congregations, individuals, local supermarkets) following "ethical" principles and using its own brand and packagings of 2 kg, 5 kg and 10 kg.

Impacts

- 1) In 8 years, the rice produced by the producers that partner with the Enterprise has increased from 350 to 1,200 tons, with a yield improvement of 30-40%.
- 2) The average income of the rice farmers has increased by 60% over the same period.

Ongoing activities

- 1) Project to expand production using organic methods.
- 2) Search for participatory financing to make credit repayment more sustainable, while giving high visibility to its work and to the Isorana rice.
