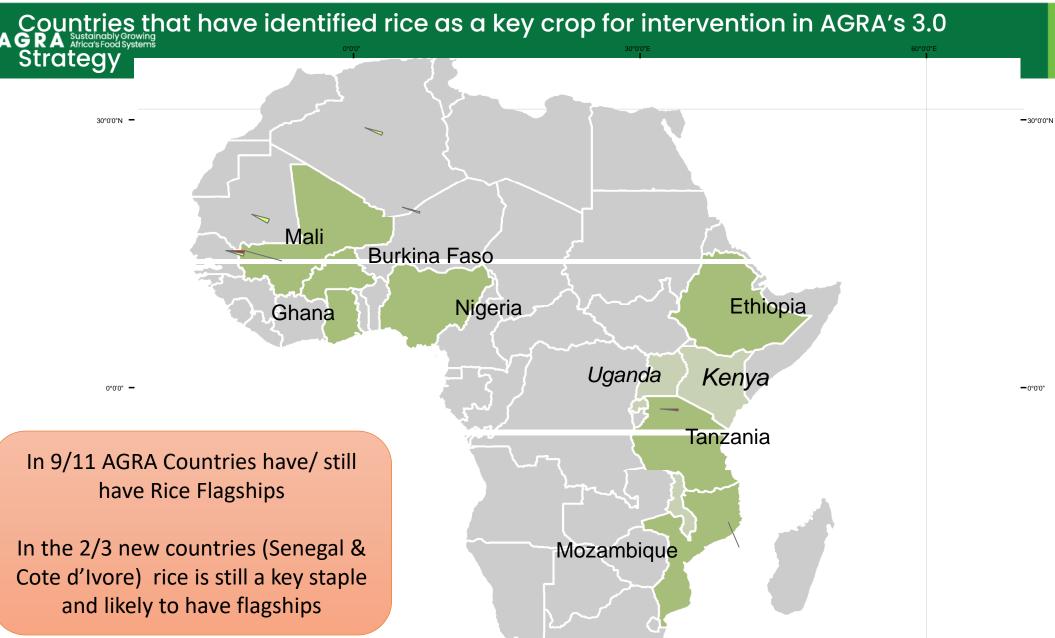

# Case Study 1: Ethiopia Rice Flagship 2023 - 2027





### Ethiopia National Rice Flagship Program (NRFP)

The development of the NRFP was initiated by a formal request from the Government of Ethiopia through the MoA to AGRA to lead conceptualization of the dev't of NRFP.



• Series of technical meetings were held with relevant institutions to further develop the inception proposals on the NRFP



• In-depth literature review, discussions and brainstorming sessions and benchmarking of previously developed Flagship programs for wheat and oilseeds



• Synthesis of lessons from other countries



• Validation of NRFP with stakeholders, finalization of the document and handover to the government

# Case Study 2: Burkina Faso Rice Flagship 2020 -2027



### What the situation was before the Rice Flagship



- Large number of fragmented, donor led projects implemented in silos
- Ambiguity around strategic priorities and targets in the sector development
- Limited coordination across the Ministry of Agriculture projects as each project comes with its own result framework and there is no built in incentive to effectively coordinate with other projects
- Lack of a dedicated resource mobilization function to coordinate donor efforts and attract private sector investments for key projects

Lack of well-designed government flagship programs with adequate institutional and financial backing to deliver the national agricultural vision

### **Objectives of the Rice Flagship**



Strategic objective

Contribute to achieving self-sufficiency in rice and improving national food and nutritional security

Specific objectives

- The planning and development in several phases of 50,000 ha of irrigated perimeters in western Burkina Faso;
- Popularization of demanded local rice varieties;
- Intensification of production, supported by current and future developments,
- Industrial processing of paddy into good quality white rice;
- Marketing at the national level of good quality and competitive rice, through an improved marketing system

Project components

- Component 1: Development of hydro-agricultural infrastructure
- Component 2: Intensification of agricultural production
- Component 3: Processing and marketing of rice production
- Component 4: Institutional framework and governance of the PPP project

### What AGRA has done supporting flagship implementation

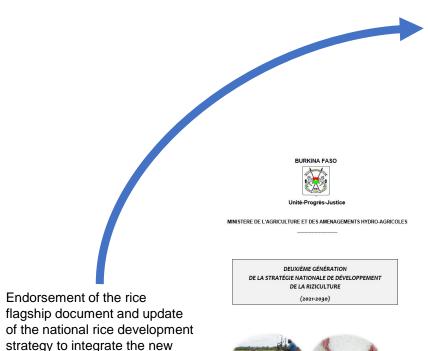


- Recruited a Senior Technical Advisor to support the Ministry in donor coordination and resource mobilization for the delivery of Agricultural flagship projects
- Worked with the Ministry and other development partners to update the national rice development strategy to reflect new ambitions in the rice value chain development
- Launched the state capacity project to help the Ministry complete the result-based programming and budgeting approach (program-budget reforms) this included completing a scoping and review for the design the Ministry program management units to effectively and efficiently manage new programmes such as the flagship

# The Government with AGRA support has been leading the flagship implementation



#### Key milestones achieved in Government with AGRA support



ambitions

Inter-ministerial committee convened to draft the PPP specifications precising Government and private investors



Official kick-off of the inter-ministerial committee workshop to draft the PPP specifications. Present were Ministers of Finance, Water resources, Agriculture and AGRA Country Manager

In a final step, a Governmental seminar will endorse five PPP projects and followed by the signature of these PPP projects with the five selected private investors

Government developed a detailed technical and financial feasibility assessment and registered the flagship in the Ministry of Finance priority PPP project pipeline

# Government role

- Long-term support to ensure the viability of the project and provide ongoing assistance and guidance to all stakeholders involved
- Mobilize the resources necessary for successful implementation of the essential components of the program
- Secure private partner investment through the implementation of robust safeguards and monitoring mechanisms
- An institutional mechanism promoting gender inclusion and considering environmental issues

# Private sector role

- Ensures the maintenance of hydro-agricultural infrastructure and equipment developed under the PPP
- Ensures the **financial viability** of the value chain and executes the investment program as defined
- Ensures the production, purchasing at farmgate, processing and marketing
- Provides the right technology and inputs on time to farmers



### **Partnership Model**

Producers

role

- **Sign contracts** with the PPP companies
- Apply the agricultural calendar as defined at the start of each crop season
- Equip themselves with the norms and standards defined in relation to the company
- Supply their productions on time and at **the price and quality negotiated** at the start of the season

Communities role

- Participate in the negotiations of agreements between the company and the producers
- Ensure the establishment of a social atmosphere allowing the respect of reciprocal commitments
- Participate more as a **guarantor of the project land** in the company's capital
- Carry out **social and infrastructural investments** in agreement with the company, the producers' organizations and in partnership with the State

### **Emerging changes as a result of AGRA's intervention**



1. Clear rice value chain development vision with supporting delivery mechanisms and strong buy-in from the Government and other development partners. Major DP funding were are aligned to support the new flagship implementation
