




Overall indicators

Progress on NRDS Processes Elaboration Phase

Activities and progress

- Development and validation of the NRDS 3: ***November 2023 to 25 July 2025 validation workshop chaired by the Minister of Agriculture;***
- Development of concept notes in February 2025
- Ongoing implementation of the Strategic Environmental Assessment of the National Rice Development Strategy (SNDR3) with funding from GIZ September to December 2025
- Participation and communication at the National Rice Days in Ségou, January 2023 (Participation in the ERO General Assembly in Abuja in May 2024)
- Presentation of the SNDR at the national forum on the PNSRI (National SRI Programme) in April 2025

Progress on NRDS Monitoring Phase

Activities and Progress

- Identification of indicators based on the RICE approach in 2024
- Organisation of the kick-off meeting on indicators in 2025
- Establishment of baseline data currently underway at the Task Force level

Best practices and challenges in implementing the SNDR

<Challenge>

- Low involvement of the private sector due to the lack of a forum for exchange;
- Inadequate funding for SNDR activities
- Lack of an SNDR monitoring and evaluation mechanism (difficulties in data collection and analysis)

<Good Example>

- Existence of a forum for exchange with technical and financial partners, allowing greater openness to innovation (Climate-Resilient Rice Production (PRCC), SRI, Sustainable Rice Platform (SRP))
- Existence of a dynamic rice inter-professional organisation that negotiates with the government on the needs of the sector
