


Overall indicators

Paddy rice production and harvested area





Activities and progress

1. NRDS validation workshop held in 2022;
2. NRDS document submitted to the President of the Republic, various ministries and technical and financial partners in 2023;
3. Five concept notes produced in 2023 as part of a workshop
4. Various projects are being funded

Progress on the M&E phase of the NRDS

Activities and progress

1. December 2023, in conjunction with DAPSA, validation of NRDS monitoring indicators
2. 16th to 18th January 2025, Organisation of national conference on rice
3. September 2025 Finalisation of the collection of basic information concerning the NRDS indicators
4. Fundraising (ongoing activity)

Best practices and challenges in implementing the SNDR

<Challenge>

- Difficulty in making it a national cause translated into political and financial commitment;
- Difficulty in mobilising sufficient financial resources to meet the needs of the value chain.

<Good Example>

- Importance of the leadership of the SNDR Task Force. Good leadership of the TFR makes it easier to mobilise stakeholders and funding, even if political commitment remains irreplaceable.
- Commitment from the outset of the process by partners and the private sector (participatory and co-construction approach)
- Performance contract between the State and the rice inter-professional organisation.

Action plans between now and the end of 2026

- Establishment of the Senegal chapter of the ECOWAS Rice Observatory
- Revision of the NRDS
- Finalise the formulation of rice projects with the AfDB, IDB, BOAD and BADEA
- Revision of concept notes
- Organisation of the second national rice conference
